Discussion questions

- 1. What is the population of your local area? Can you make a breakdown of that population what kind of people live there? Where are they from originally?
- 2. What organisations do you have in your local area? Which places do you think are most important to your community? Where do you like to go when you're in your local area?
- 3. What is special or unique about your area? Have any historical events taken place there? Do you have any local festivals or traditions? What events happen in your community?
- 4. Are there any boundaries that you're aware of, around or inside your community? Are there places you can't go?

Follow-up discussion (facilitate discussion around these questions after the learners have completed the activities)

- 1. What surprised you about the places other people marked on their maps? Why?
- 2. Were there any similarities between other people's choices and your own?
- 3. In what ways might this exercise change your thinking about sectarianism in your community?
