







First supermarket book tour to be held during Book Week Scotland 2019

Crime author Helen Fields to visit Asda superstores across Scotland

Scottish Book Trust, the national charity changing lives through reading and writing, has today launched the first supermarket book tour with crime author Helen Fields as part of Book Week Scotland 2019. Helen will host free events in five Asda superstores across east and central Scotland over three days. With one in ten books in the UK sold in supermarkets¹, these stores can play an important role in communities, opening up opportunities for both book lovers and more reluctant readers.

Former criminal barrister Helen Fields is the author of best-selling DI Callanach crime thriller series set in Scotland. She spent years working with the police, CPS, Social Services, expert witnesses and in Courts Martials, and has used these experiences to inspire and inform her critically acclaimed books. The most recent instalment *Perfect Crime*, set in Edinburgh, follows the investigation of a series of murders disguised as suicides. As part of the Book Week Scotland celebrations, there will be 20 free copies of *Perfect Crime* given away at each Asda event.

Marc Lambert, CEO of Scottish Book Trust, said: "It's an exciting milestone for Scottish Book Trust to host the first supermarket book tour as part of Book Week Scotland. This is an opportunity for us to ensure even more people across the country can access Book Week Scotland events. I'm sure that supermarket shoppers will be delighted to discover Helen Field's thrilling novels and hear about her stories first-hand."

During Book Week Scotland, Helen will also appear at an event at Waterstones West End on Friday 22 November in conversation with Fife-based crime writer Neil Broadfoot.

Initiated by the Scottish Government and supported by £200,000 from the National Lottery through Creative Scotland Targeted Funding and £26,000 from SLIC, Book Week Scotland 2019 will be delivered by Scottish Book Trust from 18 November – 24 November.

Helen Fields, said: "I'm thrilled and excited to have the opportunity to join the Book Week Scotland celebrations. Books can't exist without readers, and there's nothing I like more than having the chance to talk about how reading benefits both individuals and communities. It's a privilege to be able to support this amazing event, and I hope you'll find the time to come and say hello."
