**Bookbug** provides free books to every child in Scotland. We want babies and young children to enjoy stories, songs and rhymes.

# **Bookbug Bags**



We give 4 free bags of books to every child:

1. Baby bag - you will get this from your health visitor when your child is 3 to 5 weeks old.



2. Toddler bag - you will get this from your health visitor when your child is 13 to 15 months old.



3. Explorer bag - you will get this from your childcare provider when your child is 3 years old.



4. Primary 1 family bag - you will get this from school when your child is 4 to 5 years old.




## You can also get:

 Gaelic Bookbug bags - these are for families interested in the Gaelic language.
