First Minister's Reading Challenge in schools 2020-21

The First Minister's Reading Challenge encourages pupils to read for pleasure and helps develop a culture of reading in schools and communities across Scotland. This national initiative is funded by the Scottish Government to help schools, public libraries and community groups to build and sustain reading cultures which encourage young people to develop a life-long love of reading.

Schools that take part have access to resources, training and funding opportunities, and can submit an entry for one of our annual national awards. Despite the school year being disrupted by lockdown, many schools still submitted entries to the Reading Challenge award categories.
