
## **Plain text version**

- 1<sup>st</sup>: Try the first chapter of a new book
- 2<sup>nd</sup>: Listen to an audiobook or episode of a podcast
- 3rd: Sign up for (or use!) your library card
- 4<sup>th</sup>: Read together before bed
- 5<sup>th</sup>: Make a festive bookmark!
- 6<sup>th</sup>: Act out a story or write your own short play!
- 7<sup>th</sup>: Write a book review to recommend a book to someone in your class
- 8<sup>th</sup>: Take an <u>extreme reading</u> photograph!
- 9<sup>th</sup>: Follow a recipe to cook or bake something together
- 10<sup>th</sup>: Watch a Christmas movie based on a book
- 11<sup>th</sup>: Take a story for a walk take turns adding the next part of the plot...
- 12<sup>th</sup>: Make a bookish decoration for your tree!
- 13th: Revisit your favourite book from when you were younger

14<sup>th</sup>: Write a letter to someone you haven't seen in a while about the book you're reading

- 15<sup>th</sup>: Write your own Christmas cracker joke
- 16<sup>th</sup>: Read together over lunch make a snack and grab something to read!
- 17<sup>th</sup>: Donate any books you don't want to read again to your local charity shop or food bank!
- 18th: Write an acrostic poem using a festive word
- 19th: Take turns reading a book aloud together
- 20th: Rewrite the lyrics to a Christmas carol or traditional song!
- 21<sup>st</sup>: Ask someone for a book recommendation
- 22<sup>nd</sup>: Talk about your favourite books or stories together
- 23<sup>rd</sup>: Watch an Authors Live broadcast together!

24<sup>th</sup>: Create a cosy reading den with blankets, pillows and books – hot chocolate optional!
