



First visit to Wales for Scottish Friendly Children's Book Tour

Storyteller Mara Menzies to tour 11 schools



Mara Menzies, Kenyan/Scottish storyteller, writer and creative director of Toto Tales, will visit 11 primary schools as part of the Scottish Friendly Children's Book Tour. From 24 – 28 May, Mara will visit around 1500 pupils from 14 schools including Trallwn Primary School, Portfield School and Castle Park Primary School.

The Children's Book Tour is supported by Scottish Friendly and organised by Scottish Book Trust, the national charity transforming lives through reading and writing. Scottish Friendly Children's Book Tours visit both primary and secondary schools, and have enthralled more than 100,000 children with visits from over 100 individual authors since they began in 1998.

For the first Scottish Friendly Children's Book Tour in Wales, Scottish Book Trust has partnered with Book Trust Cymru to encourage schools to apply. As a result, almost 200 Welsh primary schools signed up for the tour.

Having spent the first 13 years of her life in Kenya, before moving to Scotland, Mara's storytelling draws on her rich dual heritage. She is the author of two children's books bringing African folklore to life; *Koko the Crocodile*, illustrated by Camilla Adams and *Starbird*, illustrated by Rachel Lemon.

Mara has recently been awarded Made in Scotland funding for *Blood and Gold*, her latest project exploring the legacy of colonialism and slavery, which will have its world premiere at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in August 2019.

During the Scottish Friendly Children's Book Tour, Mara will work with both lower and upper primary school classes, and introduce storytelling to the pupils, explaining how stories are shared by heritage and that they exist all around us. There will be a chance for pupils to create their own stories during the interactive session.


